

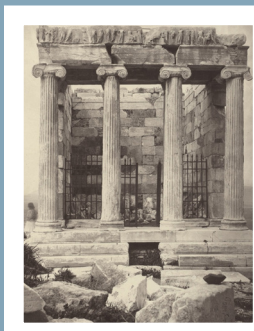

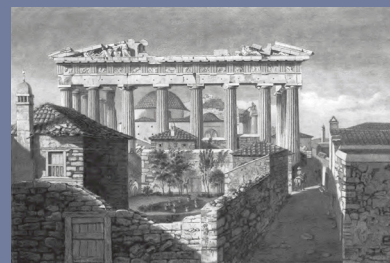

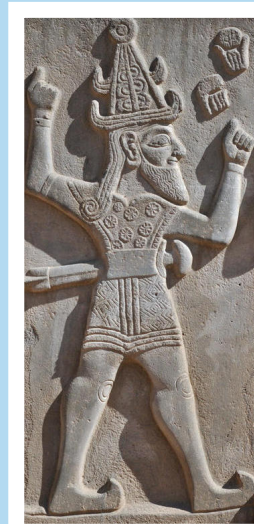
### LECTURE: IN THE EYE OF THE STORM:
