Free Fridays this November at the Michael C. Carlos Museum

[Atlanta, Georgia, October 13, 2021]— In recognition of Native American Heritage Month, the Carlos Museum is offering free admission on select Fridays this November. Members of the public may visit free of charge on November 5, 12, and 19.
